

YEAR 5/6 CEE NETCALL COMPETITION

- Schools will play each other within groups, in a round robin format across two courts.
- Players must rotate their position after every half time and full time. Players must not stay in one position and other members must be given the chance to play in defence/attack.
- Maximum of 1 team per school.
- 5 players per team, with a maximum squad of 8.
- Only two boys are allowed on the court at the same time with a maximum of three boys in the squad.
- The top 3 teams will go through to the Gateshead Finals.
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools closer to the event.
- Spectators not permitted.















EYFS MULTI-SPORT FESTIVAL

- The EYFS Multi-Sport Festival involves a carousel of activities for your pupils to practice and develop fundamental movements while taking part in fun challenges.
- Activities will be led by leaders/coaches wherever possible. If staff have to lead on activities, schools will be made aware prior to the event.
- Schools may enter a maximum of 1 team, which consists of a maximum of 15 pupils.
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools closer to the event.
- Spectators not permitted.









KSI WOOR ERICKET FESTIVAL

- The KS1 Indoor Cricket Festival involves a carousel of activities for your pupils to practice and develop fundamental movements while taking part in fun challenges.
- The event will be lead by the Durham Cricket Foundation.
- Activities will be led by leaders/coaches wherever possible. If staff have to lead on activities, schools will be made aware prior to the event.
- Schools may enter a maximum of 1 team, which consists of a maximum of 15 pupils.
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools closer to the event.
- Spectators <u>not</u> permitted.





YEAR S/4 MWW CASKETCALL

- Schools can enter a maximum of 1 team.
- Minimum of 5 pupils per team, from a maximum squad of 8.
- Unlimited substitutions can be made throughout the match ideally during a break in play.
- There must be a minimum of 2 boys and 2 girls on court at all times.
- Pupils must wear suitable shoes for an indoor sportshall.
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools closer to the event.
- Spectators <u>not</u> permitted.







SEND & MCLUSION ENCLAND NETCALL

- Schools can enter a maximum of 1 team.
- This festival will will focus on netball skills and development on a carousel of different stations for schools to rotate around throughout the event.
- This event will be non-competitive, skills based learning but will also incorporate fun exhibition games between schools incorporating the element of competition, but will not be officially scored.
- Maximum of 10-15 pupils per team. Pupils must be on the SEND register, or pupils who do not typically attend our usual competitive events.
- Packed lunch required.
- Festival will be ran in partnership with a representative of England Netball.

TOP SPORTSAULITY: COCCAA FESTIVAL

- Schools can enter a maximum of 3 teams.
- Minimum of 3 pupils per team, from a maximum squad of 5 Key stage 2 pupils.
- Attending pupils must be on the SEND register.
- Teams can be single sex, however a mixture is preferable.
- Pupils must wear suitable shoes for an indoor sportshall.
- Packed lunch required.
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools closer to the event.
- Spectators <u>not</u> permitted.





YEAR 5/6 MWO MOCKEY

- Schools can enter a maximum of 2 teams.
- Teams consist of 6 pupils from a maximum squad of 10.
- 3 boys & 3 girls must be on the pitch at all times.
- Teams will play one another in their group in a 'round-robin' format.
- Rolling substitutes throughout games, ideally during a break in play.
- No goalkeepers.
- Players <u>MUST</u> wear shin pads at all times.
- Players <u>MUST</u> wear suitable footwear for astro turf (no studs).
- Successful teams will go through to the year 5/6 hockey finals.
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools closer to the event.
- Spectators <u>not</u> permitted.



















SEND TABLE CRICKET FESTIVAL

- Schools can enter a maximum of 1 team.
- Teams consist of 7 players, rotating the players after every game. Attending pupils must be on the SEND register.
- There must always be 1 girl on the pitch at all times.
- Teams will play one another in their group in a 'round-robin' format.
- There will also be a 'chill out area' for children who may need to take a break.
- This competition will focus on SEND table cricket development and skills, and will also have a competitive element to the event as well.
- Players <u>MUST</u> wear suitable footwear for an indoor hall.
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools closer to the event.
- Spectators not permitted.





YEAR 5/6 SWMMWC

- Schools can enter a maximum of 1 team.
- A team consists of 8 swimmers (4 boys & 4 girls) from year 5/6 and a reminder that we stipulate that all swimmers must be able to swim a minimum distance of 50m unaided.
- INDIVIDUAL: 25m Freestyle ('A' Swimmers), Freestyle ('B' Swimmers), Breaststroke, Backstroke
- RELAY RACES: (4x25m) Medley Relay (to include all 4 individual races above) & Freestyle Relay
- Each school should nominate 1 boy and 1 girl for each of the 4 individual races and all swimmers will take part in BOTH relays (i.e. all swimmers will compete on 3 occasions during the event – 1 individual race & 2 relays).
- No diving, all swimmers will start in the pool.
- Clean flip/flops (or equivalent), overshoes or bare foot only.
- Spectators allowed, first come first serve on seating.







KS1 GRLS FOOTCALL FESTIVAL

- Schools can enter a maximum of 1 team
- Teams consist of a maximum of 10–15 pupils.
- Pupils must wear suitable shoes for an indoor sportshall.
- The festival is aimed at girls who are new to football, where schools will carousel around age appropriate football activities and games.
- Activities will be led by leaders/coaches wherever possible. If staff have to lead on activities, schools will be made aware prior to the event.
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools closer to the event.
- Spectators <u>not</u> permitted.





YEAR B/4 QUEKSTICKS HOCKEY

- Schools can enter a maximum of 3 teams.
- Teams consist of 4 pupils from a maximum squad of 7.
- There must always be 1 girl on the pitch at all times.
- Teams will play one another in their group in a 'round-robin' format.
- Rolling substitutes throughout games, ideally during a break in play.
- No goalkeepers.
- Players <u>MUST</u> wear shin pads at all times.
- Players <u>MUST</u> wear suitable footwear for astro turf (no studs).
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools closer to the event.
- Spectators <u>not</u> permitted.















TOP SPORTSABLITY: CREATIVE PERFORMANCE

- Schools can enter a maximum of 1 team.
- Teams consist of a maximum of 10-15 key stage 2 pupils.
- Coaches will run the activities for your pupils.
- Teams will carousel around different stations throughout the day which will focus on development and participation, rather than competition.
- This event is focused on pupils within the SEND register, or children who are not usually picked for, or may lack the confidence in competitive sport.
- Pupils must wear shoes appropriate for a sportshall.
- Further details including the event risk assessment will be sent to registered schools closer to the event.
- Spectators allowed and must sit in the viewing gallery above the sportshall at all times, no photography.
